

rom relaxing on a soothing 2,640-foot beach or by one its renowned pools, sampling the freshest and tastiest of cuisines to playing golf on a Jack Nicklaus-designed course or experiencing Hawaiian culture, Four Seasons Hualalai has it all. Want to take a helicopter ride over an active volcano or ride horseback through an ancient valley? Well, that's available at Hualalai as well.

The biggest challenge of staying at the world-renowned resort may be stumping the friendly staff by choosing an activity the property does not provide.

"It's a very special place," says Hualalai General Manager Robert Whitfield. "These days, there are so many fabulous places all over the world. The rooms feature furnished lanais, slate floors and natural hardwood trim, as well as granite bathrooms with deep soaking tubs, dual vanities and glassencased showers.

Throw in outdoor gardens, lava rock showers, flat-screen TVs with Bose entertainment systems and wireless Inter-

net, and the largely oceanfront rooms are a happy haven for guests.


> The Palm Grove Pool is a 40' x 50' adults-only pool that features a Jacuzzi, 2,500-square-foot deck made



Hualalai has been rewarded for its excellence, receiving dozens of awards from organizations and media entities around the globe.






"The fundamental food philosophy for this resort is the Farm to Table concept," Whitfield says. "More than 75 percent of our fresh food, produce and meat is sourced locally from this island. We're buying it because it's local and it's fantastic.

"We're very lucky that we have an incredible community of farmers committed to supporting the hotel by growing extremely high quality products. Our guests definitely appreciate that."

Eco-Friendly

In addition to partnering with local farmers, Hualalai also partners with a local non-profit, Hawaiian Legacy Hardwoods, in an effort to see that up to 500,000 koa trees are planted. As legacy trees, they will not be harvested and will live out their life in the native Hawaiian forest, contributing to the lush beauty of the island and guaranteeing preservation of the species. This conservation effort is part of Four Seasons' global effort to see that 10 million trees are planted around the world in celebration of its 50th anniversary.
